

#### Core Obstetric Ultrasound Hands-on Course

The Core Obstetric Ultrasound Hands-on Course is designed to offer practical elements and basic knowledge components within the scope of the core ultrasound curriculum. It is intended for Obstetricians and Gynecologists and other professionals (Radiologists and Midwives) whose experience in obstetric ultrasound is as yet limited and who wish to further hone their skills. #### Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics: Postpartum Hemorrhage Course
